Welcome

Thank you for your interest in the 2017 Mira Mesa Summer String Camp! This camp experience, designed primarily for musicians in grades 9 - 12 , serves to provide musicians an opportunity to invest some time on their respective instruments, be exposed to unique enrichment classes, and spend time with their peers prior to the start of the traditional academic year. Elements of the camp include not only large ensemble music making opportunities, but also guided coaching sessions with established string professionals, guest sessions presented by invited speakers, and team-building activities.

Masterclass Offerings

Camp will begin each day, Monday through Thursday, with a masterclass. Session topics are influenced heavily by student registration input. Simply stated, the sessions are planned around student requests, and as such, take time to coordinate.

Please note, the Daily Schedule may be adapted to meet the needs of our guest presenters.

Sessions will be filled into the schedule after input is collected on student registrations. From there, classes will be scheduled and presenters recruited.

For reference, here are a sampling of topics and presenters from recent camps: *Focused Practice Strategies* (Dr. Karen Childress-Evans), *Transitioning from High School to College* (Professor Michael Gerdes and Taylor Carlson), *Orchestral Bowings - How and Where* (Alyze Dreiling), *Chamber Music and Interactive Performance* (Jory Herman), *Audition Preparation* (P.J. Cinque), *Bow Articulation Variety* (Isaac Allen), and *Conducting 101* (Dana Mambourg-Zimbric).

Getting the Most Out of Your Instrument

Developing a Secure & Relaxed Vibrato

Co-presented on Wednesday morning by [Professor Travis Maril](#) (Violist, String Academy Coordinator, and String Coordinator at San Diego State University), and [Carina Voly](#) (Cellist, String Academy Cello Teaching Artist) on Wednesday.



Introduction to the Alexander Technique

School Issued Instruments

All students who require an instrument will be provided one for the week. Mr. Mulvaney and additional student leaders will be available beginning at 8:00 AM on Monday in order to help facilitate instrument loans.

Practice & Preparation

Students are encouraged to maintain a regular practice routine throughout the summer. Maintaining a regular routine to sharpen your musical and technical skills will help you find more consistent success once the academic year begins.

A sound practice routine likely includes:

- *Scales* - Play scales in as full a range as is possible, and in a variety of bowing styles (detaché, slurred, staccato, full bows, etc)
- *Etudes* - Etudes specific to your instrument to increase your technical capacity
- *Literature* - Solo and/or orchestral literature to further your own musicianship

There are a number of free online resources that may be utilized to secure the materials noted above. The [Internet Music Score Library Project](#) (IMSLP) is an amazing resource for all instruments. In addition, stringskills.com has a fabulously organized website that offers information on shifting, scale and arpeggio fingering suggestions, bowings, and more.

Throughout the week, photos may be taken at camp.
